On behalf of the School of Earth Sciences I would like to welcome you to Bristol. We are delighted that you are joining us and I hope that you will enjoy your time with us and find it an exciting and rewarding educational experience. This letter and the information enclosed explains what you can expect during Introductory Week, and what we need you to do beforehand.

As a Joint Honours student you will be attached to both Earth Sciences and the Department of Archaeology and Anthropology, and your degree programme is 'owned' by the Faculty of Science. You will register with all three in Introductory Week and attend induction sessions and activities in Earth Sciences and in Archaeology and Anthropology. All of these are shown on the timetable.

I enclose a Maths Primer for you to work through before you arrive. It is absolutely essential that you do this, particularly if you have done no maths since GCSE.

Other enclosures include a programme for introductory week, a book list and various information sheets and forms. **The field equipment order form and the preliminary field trip booking form should be returned to the School of Earth Sciences by Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September.**

During the term there will be some day field excursions so you should make sure that you have warm clothing, walking boots and a full set of waterproofs with you. Longer field classes will take place during the vacations. Please make sure your tetanus immunisation is up to date.

Please note there will be Science Faculty progress exams at the beginning of the 2nd term on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> & Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2012 and *you must make sure that you are in Bristol on those days*. In the unlikely event of your failing units at the end of the year, resit exams take place during the first 14 days of September and you are advised to avoid booking a holiday at this time.
